Keynote Speaker – John William Oliver, Jr, professor emeritus of history at Malone University in Ohio, was clerk/convener of the Quaker Historians and Archivists biennial conferences and served on the executive committee of the Ohio Academy of History. He has edited J. Walter Malone: The Autobiography of an Evangelical Quaker and written other pieces on Walter and Emma Malone, issues of race and gender among Quakers in Kenya, and in Cleveland in the later nineteenth century. The Quaker Heritage of Fifteen American Colleges and Universities with Charles and Caroline Cherry, of the Historical Dictionary of the Friends (Quakers) with Margery Post Abbott. Mary Ellen Chijioke, and Ben Pink Dandelion.

John's forthcoming Seeing Small. Twists in a Family's Search for Meaning, Technology, Mystery, Light and Power will explore the impact of fundamentalism and evangelicalism on Evangelical Friends (Eastern Region) in the United States. He encourages Friends to engage in further research on the impact of the American Religious Right on Quakerism in the non-Western world as well as on Quakerism in North America.
